

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The Main Course The changing care in the modulator era

CF patient care and needs have changed since the advent of highly effective modulators, including nutrition therapy. Weights/BMIs are increasing and enzyme/vitamin requirements are also changing for a few. We need more focus on monitoring for chronic and age-related conditions such as GI cancers, pancreatitis, heart disease, bone disease and other potential complications related to normal weight obesity/obesity. The Main Course Parenthood experiences in CF

A Qualitative Exploration of Parenthood Experiences and Needs Among People with Cystic Fibrosis.

This study looked at qualitative interviews with 37 people with cystic fibrosis where parents discuss what it is like living with cystic fibrosis and having children. Five key themes were discovered among the participants: 1.) The responsibilities of parenthood and the responsibilities of CF care often conflict, 2.) Delegating tasks to partners or extended family can help, 3.) Patients with CF desire support/resources specific to parenting from their CF team, 4.) It is logistically and emotionally difficult to avoid illnesses transmitted from children, 5.) Parents with CF desire clinic-facilitated connections with other parents with CF for support.

The Main Course Food insecurity screening and local food access

Food insecurity (FI) continues to be a significant issue in the US, and families with an individual with CF are no different. Screening for and offering options for food insecurity is associated with improved nutrition outcomes, especially when screened using paper vs verbal screen.

This is especially vital when individuals live in a food desert. My.CFF offers many tools for starting the process of screening for FI, as well as suggestions for interventions. COMPASS is another resource available for teams.
